1 Call to Order		

#### 1. Call to Order.

Chair Akiko Yamazaki called the meeting to order at 4:45 p.m., a quorum being present.

#### 2. Approval of Minutes

Minutes from the March 29, 2016 meeting were approved as written.

#### 3. Chair's Report

Ms. Yamazaki thanked those who participated in the pre-meeting gallery viewing of the three spring shows and thanked curators Qamar Adamjee, Jeffrey Durham and Natasha Reichle for conducting the tours. Akiko reported on the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Golden Gala, celebrated in grand style, which netting \$1.28 million, and she thanked all for their support. She introduced the Silicon Valley

Program Series, which was official launched in January, noting its purpose is to grow awareness of the museum by building a base of support and participation in Silicon Valley. She noted Leadership Gifts Officer Karen Kwan is in charge of the program. Karen spend time in the museum each week, but she is based in Palo Alto in office space provided by Trustee Nick Unkovic's firm, Squire Patton Boggs. Akiko reviewed programs from January through May. Akiko closed her report highlighting another new initiative called Game Changers Art + Tech Talks, hosted approximately quarterly featuring interesting speakers in the tech world.

# 4. Director's Report

Director Jay Xu thanked Akiko for her leadership not only on the campaign on the museum transformation but in encouraging and guiding the museum toward technology as a useful tool in enhancing and transforming the visitor experience – starting with content, story and how technology can help tell stories and engage the audience. Jay noted that later in his report, he would call on some of his colleagues to talk about some experiments that the museum is working on. Jay thanked the the Society for Asian Art for their 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary birthday gift to the museum, Collected Letters, by Lui Jianhua, which was recently installed in the loggia. Jay called on Karin Oen, Assistant Curator of Contemporary Art, who presented the Art Hit on the Liu Jianhua Installation. Dr. Xu resumed his report highlighting the Golden Gala, Chinese New Year Parade, the success of the three spring exhibitions (Pearls on a String, Hidden Gold and China at the Center), and Solid Gold, the public anniversary party on opening night held March 3. Additional highlights included the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Weekend Celebration on March 5 and 6, the 500,000<sup>th</sup> free visitor on Target Sunday, the March 1 announcement of the plans for the addition of an expanded special exhibition pavilion, Asia Week in New York, Art Basel Hong Kong, the gift of 140 Japanese Ink Paintings from the George Gund Collection, and a Publishing Professional Network Award for the museum's Seduction: Japan's Floating World. Concluding his report, Jay called on Director of Education and Interpretation Deborah Clearwaters and Head of Digital Experience Jonathan Lee who presented on prototyping, evaluation methods, and digital masterpiece prototyping.

#### 5. Development Report

Chief Philanthropy Office Nancy Brennan reported a very positive year to date, noting achievement of \$6.3 million of the \$9.9 million goal. She reported results of 64%, 60% and 70%, respectively, for annual, exhibition and membership goals. Ms. Brennan reviewed progress to date toward FY 16 Strategic Priorities that include increasing capacity for solicitations, prioritizing upgrades for Jade Circle and Nexus, and recruiting volunteer solicitors to increase outreach. She discussed exhibition support and reviewed the roster of upcoming exhibitions seeking support.
