1. Call to Order

Chair Anthony Sun called the meeting to order at 4:10 p.m., a quorum being present. Mr. Sun welcomed trustee-elect Robert Tsao, and guests from the AAM Council. He encouraged everyone to stay for the Connoisseurship Presentation immediately following adjournment of the meeting – a presentation by Senior Research Fellow, Chinese Painting and Calligraphy Dr. Joseph Z. Chang entitled, "Word as Art/Art as Words".

2. Approval of Minutes

Minutes from the March 27, 2012 meeting were approved as written.

3. Chair's Report

Tony Sun remarked on his impressions of *Phantoms of Asia* as they have evolved over the course of the exhibition, and he introduced a video highlighting *Phantoms*' opening week events set to inspiring music. Before introducing Director of Education Deborah Clearwaters to present the Art Hit: "Gallery Interpretation Tools," Tony announced the renewal of Director Jay Xu's contract for a three year period.

4. Director's Report

Director Jay Xu surveyed highlights since the March meeting that included successes surrounding *Phantoms* opening activities, transitions in the development department, upcoming exhibitions and a report on the museum's technology assessment project.

5. Finance Report

In his opening remarks to introduce CFO Mark McLoughlin for the finance report, Treasurer Tim Kahn noted the report would include operating results through April and forecast and the 2013 operating budget. Tim noted his Treasurer's report at the upcoming September 18 annual meeting would give a longer term perspective on debt service and the debt burden. In his report, Mark McLoughlin presented 2012 budget and forecast, noting the museum would achieve a balanced budget for 2012, finishing the year at breakeven or with some upside. Mark reviewed April year-to-date results. He reviewed the 2013 operating budget which had been approved by the Budget & Finance Committee, noting a forecast for an approximate 6% increase in attendance and resulting increases in revenue and expenses. He explained a \$600,000 increase in CCSF funding resulting from restoration in security guard hours, and a tactical decision to increase funding to cover three development staff additions that will help drive contributions. Mark reviewed key performance indicators – attendance, net promoter score, website visits, earned income and contributed income, an exhibition KPI snapshot comparing the Bali and Maharaja exhibitions and the FY 11/12 attendance forecast.

6. Consideration and Possible Action Items

a. Approval of Combined City and Foundation Operating Budget for Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2013

WHEREAS, Members of the Commission and Foundation Budget & Finance Committees reviewed the combined City and Foundation operating budget, exclusive of investment income and debt service, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013; and

WHEREAS, The members have recommended that the budget be presented to the Commission and Foundation for approval; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the combined City and Foundation operating budget for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013 for the Asian Art Museum, a copy of which is on file with the finance department, is approved as proposed, subject to final City budget approval.

b. Transfer of Funds in the Admission Fund FY 2012-2013

RESOLVED, That the Asian Art Commission does hereby authorize the Controller of the City and County of San Francisco to transfer monthly excess revenue over monthly admission operating expenses in the **Admission Fund (2S CRF RPD) Index Code 620008 to Project PAA002, Index Code 620008** on a monthly basis during fiscal year 2012-2013; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the funds in **Project PAA002** are to be used to reimburse the Asian Art Museum Foundation for expenses incurred on behalf of the Museum.

When such funds are provided or managed by an entity, and not an individual, the entity must agree in writing to abide by the disclosure requirements of this section. The disclosure shall include the names of all individuals or organizations contributing such money and a statement as to any financial interest the contributor has involving the City.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco International Airport Museum (SFO Museum) requests a loan of 96 ceramics from the Asian Art Museum (AAM) for an exhibition entitled *Pan Asian Ceramics* to be held from December 22, 2012 through June 23, 2013 in the International Terminal; and

WHEREAS, The Director and the Chief Curator recommend the loan to the SFO Museum; now, therefore, be it
